CHANGE IN SECURITY

This past June, Junior Tyus Muckenstrum witnessed a man being pulled out of a truck at a gas station while yelling "help, help, he's not breathing!" Tyus told his brother to call 911, checked for a pulse, there was no pulse, and began chest compressions. After 3-5 minutes the paramedics arrived, checked with Tyus that the 24 year old man had no pulse when he began compressions, and Tyus told the EMT that he did not. The EMT told Tyus that the man did now and that he had saved his life

This past July, Sophomore John Mariscal witnessed his 6 month old baby niece choking on a piece of banana. The parent was not exactly sure what to do, but John being CPR certified in class last year, took the baby and began chest thrusts and back slaps. On the 10th back slap the piece of banana came out thus saving his nieces' life!
