Mission Statement

The mission of Carson Middle School is to provide all students an equal opportunity to learn in a safe, structured environment. In doing so, we will work with parents, students and community members to promote life long learners.

Principal's Highlights

Carson Middle School teachers, staff, and parents work together to ensure a positive and safe educational experience for all of our students.

- CMS implemented a modified block schedul to maximize instruction time and increase student engagement.
- Forty-five percent (45%) of English Language learning students successfully tested out of English as a second language (ESL) services.
- Eighteen teachers received high quality sheltered instruction (HQSI) training.
- Five teachers and three administrators completed TESOL endorsement training.
- Professional Learning Communities (PLC's) implemented common formative assessments to target student mastery of standards.
- Academic Core Enrichment (ACE) time was incorporated into the schedule to provide students with additional academic support, guidance, and enrichment.
- The CMS Family Engagement Team hosted monthly family workshops to increase parent involvement and engagement.
- CMS started a Watch DOGS (Dads of Great Students) program for adult male role models to volunteer on campus.
- CMS students participated in US Navy Sea Cadets programs and trainings.




Per-Pupil Expenditures 2010-2011

Carson Middle School believes that parent communication is essential to student success. We communicate with our parents in both English and Spanish to ensure parents receive information. Our teaching staff posts assignments and grades via PowerSchool to communicate academic progress. Grades are available in real-time online and progress reports are sent home every nine weeks. Phone Messenger is utilized on a regular basis to inform parents of upcoming events, special bulletins, and student attendance. Our website has been updated this year in an effort to improve our communication with parents. Family Engagement events took place every month to increase family involvement and engagement. CMS hosted an annual Open House, Technology Night, Science Night, Veteran's Day Memorial, Career Day, and mock job interviews to involve our entire community. CMS implemented student led conferences for 6th grade students and parents. Our Parent Teacher Association (PTA) is very active in supporting our school and meets on a monthly basis.
